Lot # 1545 CA , San Francisco Spreckels Rotisserie Wine List 1899 Spreckels Rotisserie was a fabulous place to have lunch back in 1900 San Francisco. It was located on the 15th floor of the Call Building. Visitors could enjoy their meals while "dining in the clouds." This is a lot of 2 items from that time. 1) May 31, 1899 lunch menu and wine list. Diners that day enjoyed salmon, leek soup, deviled crabs, fired frogs and a choice of several red and white wines. 2) Wine list, most likely presented at dinner time.

Lot # 1546 CA , San Francisco West Coast Distillery Co. Group c1875 This is a lot of 3 pieces. 1) Bussiness card for Joseph M. Armelli. 3) & 4) are unused stocks for the West Coast Distillery Co. They are stock no. 443 and 449, c1870. Both items have some wear including stains and writing.

Lot # 1547 CA , Stockton E. May & Company (Stockton) Occidental Bourbon
Three billheads - all different. Includes an unused return envelope. Sold to Frank Mitchler of the
Murphys Hotel just up the road from Stockton.

Lot # 1548 CA Stockton Kohlberg & Cavagnaro liquor dealers pieces. Three different billheads and an unused envelope. Manitou Mineral Water and Manitou Ginger Champagne. One billhead has condition issues - see photo. Benjamin H. Kohlberg was in the business of selling cigars and tobacco on 224 Main Street in Stockton, California in 1876. By 1880 he had moved his store to 158 Hunter Street, or the corner of Weber and Hunter. He was still doing business here by 1887. Frank Cavagnaro in 1886 was running a saloon in this city on El Dorado Street, between Main and Market. By 1888, Frank had sold his bar and opened another called the Elite Saloon on 261 Main Street. Sometime between this period and 1893 Frank Cavagnaro formed a partnership with Ben Kohlberg and began to wholesale wines liquors and cigars. They operated from a store at 523 Main Street. If the partnership lasted through 1895 it is not known. They were partners through 1894, and by 1896 Frank Cavagnaro was the sole owner. Data was found to be scarce on the company after this time. It is known though that after 1903 neither Frank nor Ben were selling liquor in Stockton.

Lot # 1549 CA , Knight's Ferry Red Mountain Vineyards, Knight's Ferry Two billheads (to Lane and Mitchler), letter, and 1893 corner advertising envelope. One bill, the letter, and the envelope are from the same group. Envelope has condition issues, please see photo. Abraham Schell was "a banker at the ferry", a capitalist, businessman and one of the most brilliant lawyers of his time in California." In 1868, he purchased property including Knights Ferry and the acres nearby upon which he founded the Red Mountain Vineyard. It is located on the Littlejohn Creek.

during WWII as a defensive unit in case of an emergency. In March 1944, it broadened out to become a riding group for men and women. 3) 1907. Invitation postcard for the carnival. Front has picture of river and trees and reads: "The Citizens of Lodi, California, cordially invite you to attend a Grand TOKAY CARNIVAL to be held September 19, 20, and 21, 1907. To be the most magnificent and elaborate affair ever attempted. Come!" Card was mailed to Stockton. 4) 1907. Postcard with pictures of Tokay grapes and men and women in formal wear. Reverse has writing from Aug. 9th, 1907. Multiple postmarks. 5) Set of six early postcards with pictures of the Tokay grapes on the front. Three of them have ZImmerman's Pharmacy in the lower left corner; two of these are black and white (one mailed 1917), and one is hand colored (mailed 1907). One of the remaining three is advertising the carnival (mailed June 1907) with a nice color image of the grapes on the front as well as pen writing. The remaining two postcards have color images of the grapes and say that the Tokay grape is white "made Lodi famous." The Tokay Carnival was a lavish three-day event that was Lodi's first official community-wide grape harvest celebration. Lodi businessmen hoped to use the carnival as a promotional event for the newly-incorporated city and the Tokay grapes. It was a big success, but too expensive. The next carnival wasn't held till 27 years later.
